## Total knee replacement (left side)

A total knee replacement involves replacing the whole knee joint with an artificial joint, made from plastic and metal parts.

### THE INTENDED BENEFITS

To reduce pain or stiffness in the knee and to improve mobility.

### ANAESTHETIC OPTIONS

General anaesthesia.

### SERIOUS- OR FREQUENTLY OCCURRING RISKS

#### Immediate risks

Surgical care during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, Nerve injury, Significant bleeding, Fracture during operation, Vascular injury, Perioperative risks, Tourniquet damage.

#### Early risks

Discomfort, Ongoing symptoms, Blood clots (deep vein thrombosis or pulmonary embolus), Knee stiffness, Postoperative bleeding, Wound infection, Haematoma (collection of blood), Infection requiring removal of prosthesis, Change in leg length, Death.

#### Late risks

Visible scar, Prosthesis wear and tear, Further procedure needed, Osteoarthritis, Chronic pain, Abnormal scarring, Joint dislocation.
